



Is your pet a healthy weight? Check now!

- Step 1:** Feel the ribs of your pet to find out his Body Condition Score.

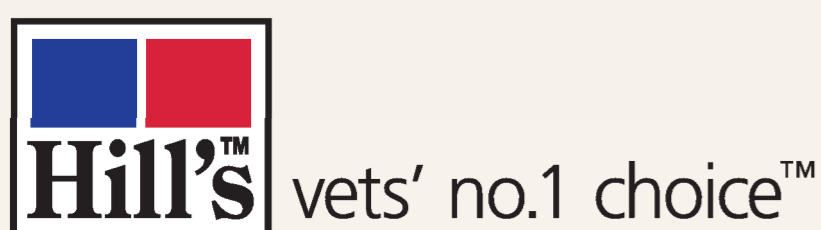
