Microchipping

Microchipping is a very simple procedure whereby a tiny microchip is placed under the skin between the dog's shoulder blades with a needle (much like having an injection). The microchip has its own ID number which is unique to your pet. Your contact details are held on a central database. If your pet is found and brought to the dog pound, pet shelter or local vet, they will be scanned to see if there is a microchip present. Microchipping greatly increases your chances of having your pet returned to you if it strays or is injured away from home. This procedure is also a requirement if you are applying for a pet passport.
